
Recommended Practices

The family, parents or other caregivers are active partners in the development and implementation of the intervention process, and the professional supports the family to take on their rightful leading role.

Transdisciplinary Teamwork



Team members from different disciplines contribute with their specific knowledge, competencies and shared responsibilities to a joint **problem solving process** throughout the ECI journey. In this journey, the family is an equal member of the team, as they have very specific knowledge about their child, their family, and their hopes for the future. The primary service provider (PSP) is the team member who supports the family address the child's development from a holistic perspective. The PSP is not alone, he keeps in touch with other providers on the team.








Individualized Family Service Plan

n the planning process, families and professionals are working together to identify the priorities the family has for their child and themselves, to choose goals that reflect those priorities, and to develop the strategies and activities that are the best match for the child and family. A well written plan is much more than filling out a piece of paper; if done well, the process of planning with families can build partnerships, self-efficacy, resilience and hope. This will contribute to improve family quality of life.

Environment

he importance of an enriched pedagogical, physical, social and temporal environment is crucial, to enhance the child's learning opportunities for engaging in learning and development. Natural environment practices use everyday experiences, events, and places as sources of child learning opportunities that promote child competencies. Adaptations and accommodations play a key role in supporting and enhancing children's participation and learning and also ensure their safety.

Families social networks are also key elements for supporting families and children in ECI.



Intervention

In the spirit of Eurlyaid we mean that more than the intervention process, it is the parent /professionals collaboration and interactions that account for the quality of intervention.
