Training

North Macedonia:

Building a National Pool of Trainers in Family-Centred Early Childhood Intervention

North Macedonia has successfully completed a Training of Trainers (ToT) programme in Family-Centred Early Childhood Intervention (FCECI), resulting in a national pool of eight certified trainers who are now leading capacity-building activities across the country.

Following the initial ToT programme, the trainers received ongoing supervision and mentoring from Ana Serrano and Snežana Ilić, supporting the implementation of family-centred practices and strengthening their training competencies.

As a major milestone of the process, the newly trained trainers independently delivered two regional training programmes under the supervision of Snežana Ilić. The first training brought together multidisciplinary teams from Western Macedonia, while the second

training, held from 1–5 June 2026, was organized for teams from Eastern Macedonia. These trainings demonstrate the successful transfer of knowledge and the growing national capacity to sustain and expand family-centred early intervention services.

In parallel, North Macedonia has initiated the translation of the EURLYAID Guide with support from UNICEF. This important initiative will contribute to the wider dissemination of evidence-based practices and provide an important resource for professionals and decision-makers involved in early childhood intervention.

The establishment of a national network of eight trainers, combined with ongoing implementation activities and the translation of key EURLYAID resources, represents an important step towards strengthening family-centred early intervention services throughout North Macedonia.

Conferences:

Adelaide, Australia

Our chair, Ana Maria Serrano has participated as an invited speaker with a Keynote presentation and did a workshop at the PRECI AUSTRALIA conference - 13th to 15th of May in Adelaide.



PRECI is a newly formed **Australian organization** aiming to support and develop a national research-to-practice network focused explicitly on the area of young children with developmental disabilities. The conference had around 400 participants among practitioners, researchers and parents. This conference was organized by our PRECI colleagues and the quality of the presentations and posters was impressive. Among the main topics discussed at the conference were:

- Inclusive Practice & Participation

- Thriving Families & Parent Participation
- Research to Practice (Knowledge Translation)
- National Practice Framework for Early Childhood Intervention (ECI)
- Tiered Systems of Support & Capacity Building

There were very intensive discussions in the sessions, in the corridors and at the dinner, an opportunity for learning and discussing experiences and knowledge. Conference topics also touched the premises of the recent work that PRECI colleagues did on the NATIONAL BEST PRACTICE FRAMEWORK FOR EARLY CHILDHOOD INTERVENTION. 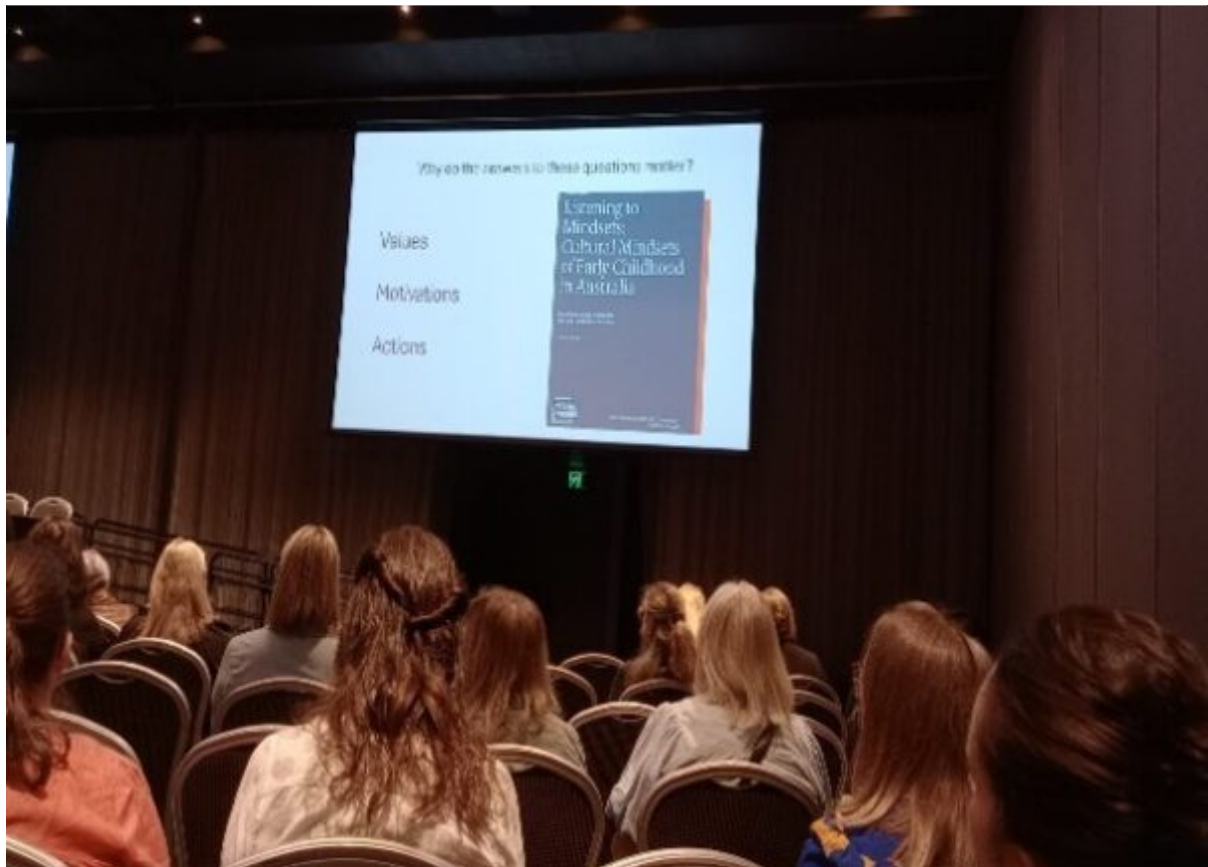
